

ball in the scramble which ensued. The visitors, however, were unable to make progress, and Sieber punted 40, Vorhis running back 8, after which Burns electrified the crowd by a beautiful 20 yard run, which was nullified by the referee bringing the ball back for holding. Maxwell 5, Coulson 20, Wray 6, Gotwals 8, Coulson 3, McCleary 4, and it looked like a "State" touch-down. But here a 10 yard penalty by the umpire ruined State's chances, and Vorhis tried a goal from field, which rolled out of bounds. Sieber at once punted 35 yards and Vorhis made a fair catch, then held the ball for McCleary in a try at goal from field. The oval sailed wide, however, and Gettysburg kicked out from their 25 yard line, Wray rushing back 10 yards. Hirshman added 8 more on a line-plunge, Gotwals 4, but here another penalty gave Gettysburg the ball. Then came the most spectacular play of the day. On a delayed pass Sieber darted out through a broken field for a beautiful run of 60 yards, before he was tackled by

Vorhis on State's 20 yard line. Gettysburg could not gain an inch in two downs, and Sieber dropped back for a try at a field goal. The pass from center was low, and the kicking captain was buried beneath an avalanche of State tacklers. After an exchange of punts the game ended in Gettysburg's territory.
