a defensive one, for on the first line-up Davis punted 40 yards, Henry coming back 25; Bill Wray immediately bumped through for 3, and Henry rounded left end behind splendid interference for 20 additional yards. A forward pass followed, Davis getting the ball; he immediately punted for 20 yards, Dunn falling on the ball for State. Burns circled the end for 3, Hirshman 2, and McCleary's 45 yard punt was muffed by Davis, Gotwals getting the oval.

After McCleary and Hirshman had made several short plunges, it was Dickinson's ball on their own 5 yard line. Davis punted 25 yards, Hirshman returning for 2, McCleary waded through the line for seven, Gotwals 2, and with the ball on Dickinson's 6 yard mark, McCleary struggled through for five, but the officials claimed hurdling, and penalized State 15 yards. Henry attempted a drop kick but it was blocked, Campbell getting the ball. Then "Junior" gained a yard, and Hirshman 2; and Henry attempted another drop kick which went straight and true, but fell short a few inches. Davis punted out from the 25 yard line, McCleary coming back five; then on a forward pass Burns reeled off 12, and on the same play, Campbell 20. With the ball on Dickinson's 10 yard line, the treacherous mud caused McCleary to slip and fall, and Henry was forced back 3 yards; McCleary 3 on a line plunge, and on a forward pass muffed by Davis, Cyphers fell on the ball on Dickinson's 2 yard line, but the officials unjustly gave the Carlisle men the oval, and Davis punted 35, Henry getting back 8. On another forward pass, Davis' great height enabled him to get the ball and he then punted 45 yards to Henry. McCleary punted 40, Burns and Dunn both hitting Davis as he

caught. A long low spiral from Davis bounded along the sidelines, Banks getting it for a 15 yard run Davis made 3 yards on a tackle play, Dickinson's only gain from lineup during the entire game! Grokey tried center but bounced back 3 yards, and then Burns threw McWhinney for a 6 yard loss. Davis tried a place kick from the 38 yard mark, but it was a poor attempt, Henry picking it up for a 10 yard advance. McCleary punted 45 and Davis sprinted back 25; Dickinson's interference held Burns, but the officials claimed they did not see it. Davis tried another place kick, Captain Dunn blocking the attempt, and McWhinney recovering the ball. An offside play on a punt by Davis gave State 15 yards, and on another 40 yard kick, Houseman tackled Henry for no gain. McCleary punted 40 yards, Davis fumbled, and Burns was on the ball like a streak. Time was called with the ball on Dickinson's 50 yard mark.

Second half:—Dickinson made no changes; but for State; Maxwell took Campbell's place. McCleary kicked off to the line, Davis returning 15 yards. He then punted 40, and Hirshman got back 10. Davis punted 40 out of bounds, and Burns opened for State with 12 yards on a forward pass, Captain Dunn being hurt in this play. After State's gritty leader recovered, Henry made a splendid, but vain attempt at a drop-kick from the 38 yard line, Davis kicked out from the 25 yard line and the ball was soon on Dickinson's 6 yardline. McCleary went through for 4, and then over for a touchdown, with every State man in the play. McCleary kicked goal, and the score stood State 6, Dickinson 0. Davis kicked off over the line to McCleary, who rushed back 25 yards. At this juncture Vorhis went in at quarter and Henry took Partridge's place at left half.

McCleary punted 40; Vorhis misjudged the ball, but recovered it; a series of punts by McCleary and Davis took place at this point, the former having slightly the better of the duel. Here Tackle Harry of Dickinson was ruled out for dirty playing, and State given 30 yards. Gotwals took the place of Dunn at centre. McWilliams took Gotwals' place, and Zink for Hirshman. A quick kick was secured by Davis, who then punted 35, Henry sprinting back for 10; then Maxwell 10,
