State is represented on the second team by Dunn, Burns, and Mc-Cleary, although no mention is made of Gotwals, who is considered by impartial judges to be one of the finest tackles in the state.

Several paragraphs of the article are devoted to a euology on the work of the W. and J. men. While the men selected for the first team are undoubtedly among the best players in the state, we fell confident that if Piekarski were not a Penn. graduate and the coach for W. and J., his choice would have been somewhat different.
