Forestry at State.

Dr. B. E. Fernow, who has been elected Professor of Forestry in the School of Agriculture and Experiment Station of The Pennsylvania State College, will be in State College on Jan. 28th to take up his work in Forestry during the second semester. A general course in Forestry will be offered, open to all students in the College who may be able to elect it and also for students who wish to specialize in the study.

Professor Fernow is the highest exponent of Forestry in this country and is noted as an inspiring teacher. He was formerly Chief of the Division of Forestry of the United States Department of Agriculture and later was Director of the New York State College of Forestry at Cornell University.
