

Dr. Gill has continued the meetings in which he answers the Biblical questions put to him by the students, and these meetings have always proved of the greatest value. The statistics are:

Total enrollment	316
Total number classes	35

Plans are on foot to add largely to this enrollment before the end of the college year, and between the preparation and the publishing of this report several classes will be started. The plans for next year contemplate reaching the five hundred mark. A much needed feature is a full Bible reference library, funds for the purchase of which are lacking.

SOCIAL

As is customary, the Association gave a reception to the entering class on the evening of Sept. 14th in the gymnasium. Addresses were made by General Beaver, Dr. Welsh, Coach Fennell and several of the students. It is estimated that over eight hundred were present. A social held at Thanksgiving in Room 529 proved very pleasant to the large number who attended.

The entertainment course as a whole was the best ever given at State College, despite the disappointment at the cancellation of the last number. Why these entertainments are so poorly patronized by the student body is a question most difficult to answer.

Until larger and more suitable quarters are provided, it will be impossible to equip a game room that will be at all adequate, the present room being entirely too small. If the room adjoining No. 277, which is at present unoccupied, could be secured for a secretary's private room and the partition between rooms No. 275 and 277 could be removed, it would afford at least a temporary relief for the present overcrowded condition.

FINANCE

As the books have not been audited as yet, no report can be made

at this time as to the finances of the Association. Such a report will be published later. Suffice to say that the Entertainment Course netted a rather meager sum, and one in no way commensurate with the character of the course. The large increase in membership will undoubtedly help the Association financially.

EQUIPMENT

Library—A number of books have been added, chiefly along the lines of Bible Study reference and the like, though several on Missions have been acquired. The Association gratefully acknowledges the kindness of Prof. Willard and others in loaning a number of most useful books.

Records—This important feature has received careful attention, and the records of the Association are now complete in all branches of its work.

Rooms—Room 529, Main Building, where the Sunday and Tuesday evening meetings of the Association are held is now too small for the former. The room seats about 250 and at the Sunday meetings the attendance is sometimes over 300.
