Amid a thunder of applause Bob Vorhis struck out Lewis and Fry, while Mason took care of Davis' warm drive over third. Then Coulson hit a rousing triple down the right line, Crutchley bunted neatly, and before Davis could field the ball, Coulson came over with the winning run for State's thirteenth straight victory. The score stood 5 to 4.
