Professor Paul.

The following extract from "The Round-Up," the weekly published by the students of New Mexico State College, will be of especial interest to the engineering students whose work brings them in association with him :

"The resignation of Prof. Chas. E. Paul from the college faculty was made public a short time before the beginning of the college year. During the two and one half years that Prof. Paul has been here he has established himself strongly in the community. His loss will be keenly felt by those who have been associated with him and especially by the mechanical engineering students who have been under his instruction.

"His thorough grasp of his subject and particularly of the application of its priuciples has made his instruction of incalculable worth to the students in the department. His ability as a teacher was unusual, and his preparation and equipment for instruction was the very best. He received his training at the Boston Institute of lechnology and later taught in the A. and M. College at Manhattan, Kansas. Under Professor Paul's administration the mechanical engineering course has grown immensely in importance and popularity. In 1906 he organized the Engineering Association among the students, one of the strongest and largest of the College societies. He has paid especial attention to mechanical drawing, giving a very thorough course in that branch. No one who has known Prof. Paul can call him anything but a hustler and a practical man. Such qualities act as a tonic in this climate.

"He goes to the Pennsylvania State College to occupy the chair of Applied Mechanics, a newly created department there. He will have some three hundred students under him—and then some. While the College and the whole community will lose a great deal by his going, the general wish is that Prof. Paul may find his work congenial and be happy.
