

Home Economics.

Our new course in Home Economics, having been made possible by an appropriation from the last State Legislature, is now firmly established with Miss Sara Lovejoy as Dean of the department and Miss Louise Waugh as assistant. Nine of our twenty co-eds are enrolled in it.

The aim of the course is to provide scientific and technical training in all matters connected with the administration of a household and, with it, such other studies as contribute to the intellectual development of the student. While its purpose is to make efficient homemakers, it is so planned as to give graduates a broad and liberal education and at the same time fit them to teach subjects connected with the work

The course correlates as far as possible with the sciences taught in the other courses. It is based upon them, and ranks with them in breadth and culture, leading to the degree of B S. It includes work in English, modern languages, mathematics, history, political science and natural sciences, as well as in music, art, sewing, cooking, bacteriology and specific subjects pertaining to Home Economics.

The fact that the work is strictly educational, that it is very practical, and that it has a distinct social value will all tend to make it deservedly popular.
