#### An Intercollegiate Track Meet.

Representatives of nine Pennsylvania colleges met at Harrisburg last Friday and formed a permanent organization which will hereafter annually conduct an intercollegiate track and field meet. These institutions are Lafayette, Swarthmore, Lehigh, W.& J., Muhlenberg, Bucknell, Temple, Carliste, Dickinson, and State. We were represented by J. M. Harding.

After a careful discussion of the situation, a constitution was adopted and officers chosen. The presidency of the league was tendered to Lafayette, the vice-presidency to State, while the secretary and treasurer will be from Dickinson. Yearly dues are to be paid to defray expenses of the secretary and a novel method of sharing the cost of the meet was agreed upon. penses of ten men for each team entered will be pooled and divided equally between the contesting colleges. Any extra men will be provided for by the institution entering them. During the convention \$200 was subscribed by the Yale and Princeton alumni clubs of Harrisburg toward the expenses of the organization.

The city of Harrisburg, through its Mayor and secretary of the Board of Trade, offered to bear the expenses of the first meet, to provide medals and prizes, and to furnish entertainment for the teams. This offer was accepted and the meet will be held on the large Island Track on May 30. The meet will be free to the public.

It is expected that this intercollegiate contest will greatly stimulate interest in track and field sports and should lead to closer athletic
