Two weeks later as the eleven trotted out on Percy Field at Ithaca, to meet Cornell, working like a model machine with every piece doing its duty and all parts working for the benefit of the whole, every man knew that to force defeat on them required more strength and more aggressiveness than even the "Big Red" team possessed. This was one of the cleanest and hardest fought contests that ever occurred on any gridiron and the result was directly due to the superiority of the Penn State team. This victory was the greatest that any State team has experienced in recent years and well may our heroes of that conflict feel proud of the precedent they established.

On Nov. 2 our old rival, Dickinson, appeared upon the scene hoping to maintain her prowess in the football world. Right from the whistle the Red and White were over whelmed and the final score and defeat was the worst in her career. Again had our team established a precedent and was entitled to the good cheer with which it left Williamsport that night.

The Penn game at Philadelphia on the following Saturday was the greatest disappointment of the season. Our team started off with a vim and covered 22 yards on the first four downs but the gloom began to settle on the next play. · Hirshman, who had been severely injured in the Cornell game, was completely disabled and forced to retire from the game. The dash and vim of the team displayed just before this accident was lacking afterward. The grit was still there but the unity of play had disappeared. Our opponents played the best game of their season and their mastery of the game made them unconquerable.
