and automobile mechanics.

Prof. Diemer will be known among us as Professor of Mechanical Engineering and head of the Mechanical Engineering Department, and will be located in the office formerly occupied by Dean Jackson. He will do some teaching, but his chiet work will be to direct the department in providing for the constant growth and for new equipment. He is fully able to carry out the plans of the department in turning out graduates who will be capable of taking the management of factories, and will no doubt be a valuable member of the faculty.

Farmers' Week.

With an attendance of over 400 and a great display of interest during the entire session, the special one week course in agriculture and related subjects was this year a greater success than ever before. Centre county led with an enrollment of 187, followed by Columbia, Chester, and Lancaster. No expense was spared to make the instruction very practical and of the highest standard. More than seventy-five subjects embracing every phase of farm life were provided. including lectures on Home Economics for the women. At the close of the course a vote of thanks was extended to the college authorities by the farmers for the excelent instruction given during the week.

Miss Mary T. Harman, a graduate of the Indiana State University, has been secured as instructor in histology, embryology, and anatomy. During several summers Miss Harman has taught in the Indiana State biological station, and she comes to us highly recommended.
