

Open Letters.

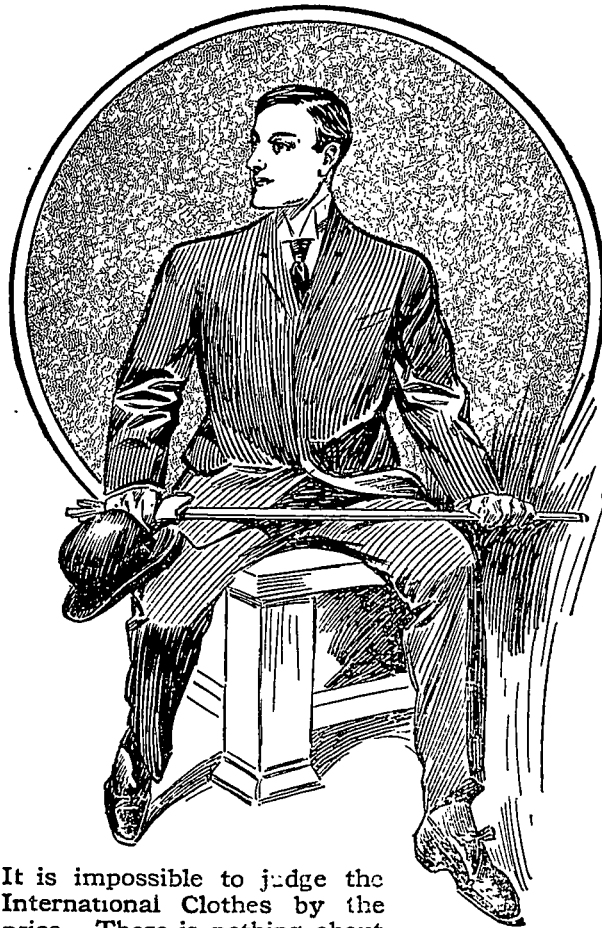
