Wed. Mar. 4, Mech. vs. Farm.; Elec. vs. Min.

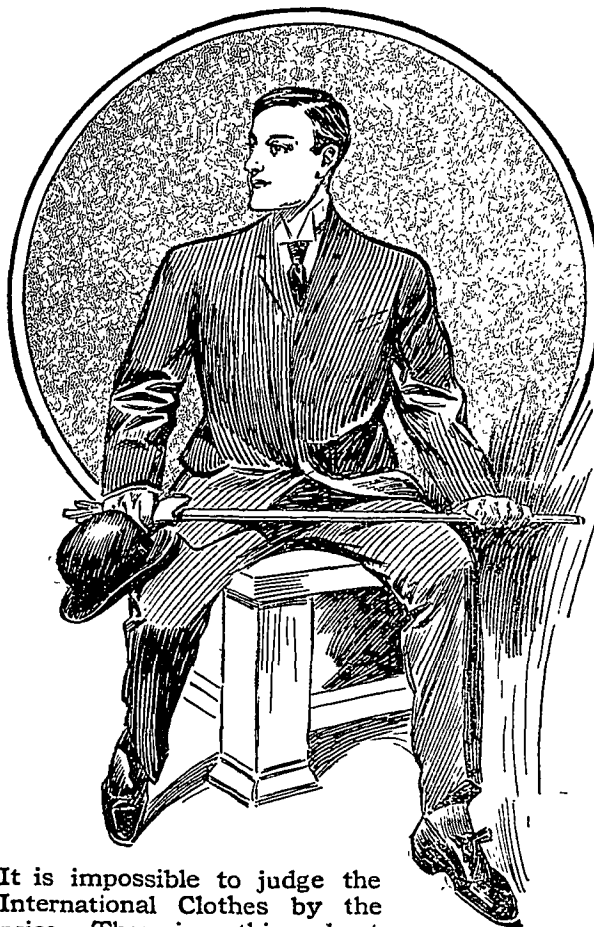
Sat. Mar. 7, Mech. vs. Chem. Elec. vs. Civ.
