

Lecture by Dr. Robt. Ellis Thompson.

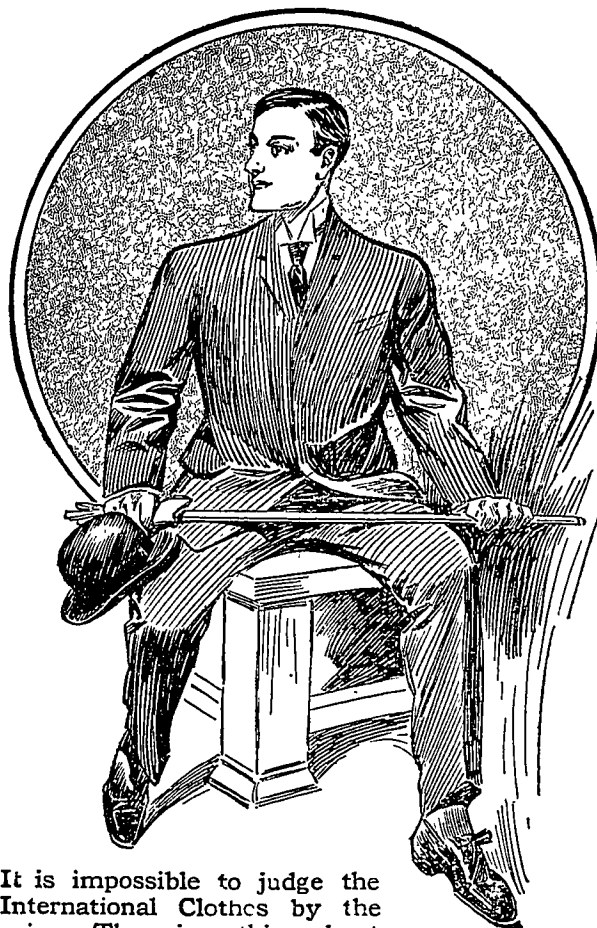
The fourth lecture in the Free Lecture Course will be delivered in the Auditorium on Saturday evening, March 14, by President Robert Ellis Thompson, Ph. D., S. T. D., of the Central High School, of Philadelphia. The title of Dr. Thompson's lecture is "The History of the Home." Before assuming the presidency of the Central High School, which is the "city college" of Philadelphia, Dr. Thompson was for thirty years professor in the University of Pennsylvania. He has delivered courses of lectures at Yale, Harvard, and Princeton, and has won a reputation as a writer and lecturer on historical and economic subjects. Doors will be open at 7 30. The lecture will begin at 8 o'clock.
