

Dr. Thompson's Lecture.

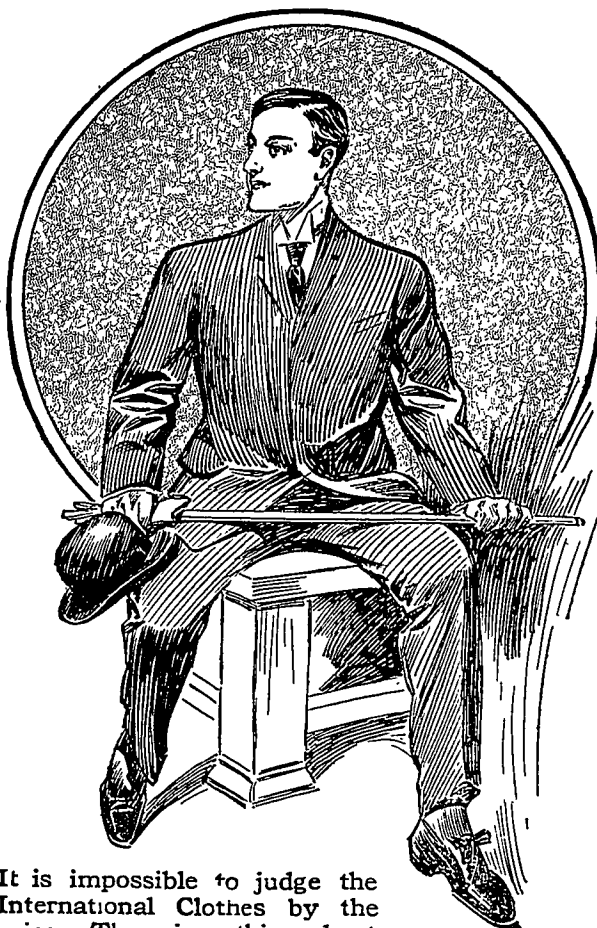
