The feature of the game was the hitting of Coulson and Haverstick, each securing a two and a three base hit. McCleary and Cree also secured two safeties each in the Rochester game. With almost one half of State's scheduled games played, the batting honors lie between Coulson, Cree and Haverstick. The race so far has been an excellent one. The five hits allowed by Lynch were doubled by the Penn State nine, and if this kind of work can be kept up, Captain Cree may this year make a record which will eclipse any previous one.
