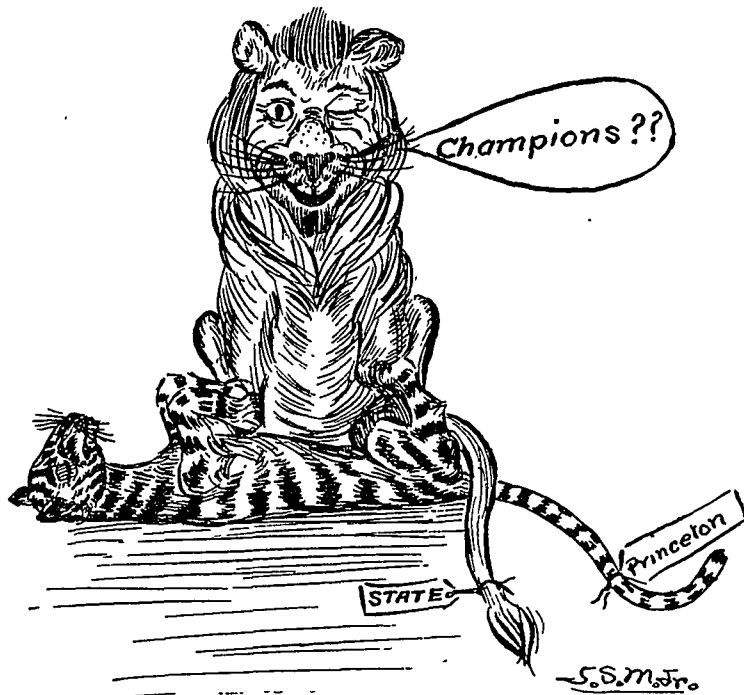

THE TIGERS DEFEATED

State Wins From Princeton, 4-3.

Last Wednesday saw the valiant sons of State lined up against the formidable Tigers for the fifth time in as many years, and when the sun had set the White and Blue had triumphed for the fourth time. Because of an apparent willingness on the part of Princeton to sidestep a game with Penn State this year, the contest was arranged only after considerable trouble on the part of the State management. The success of our teams at the New Jersey institution shows that the Tiger's fear of the Nittany Lion is not ill-founded.

Captain Cree's nine made its runs thus. Bob Vorhis opened the third inning with a single to left and Cree sacrificed him to second.

Then McCleary made a pretty outfield single, on which Vorhis scored. Hirshman went out; then Haverstick singled, but McCleary was caught at the plate. The other three runs were tallied in the eighth when Hirshman singled through the infield after McCleary had been retired. Hirshman went to second on Sides' error and Haverstick made his second hit of the game. Larry Vorhis now worked Heyniger for a base on balls after Kelley had flied out, and Mitinger also took the easy path to first base, thus forcing in a run. Then Haverstick and Vorhis scored on an error at first base, but Fish recovered the ball in time to get Mitinger at the plate.
