Professor P. B. Breneman.

The chair of Mechanics and Materials of Construction, made vacant by the resignation of Professor Chas. E. Paul, has been filled by the appointment of Professor P. B. Breneman, recently of Purdue University.

Professor Breneman was born in Huntingdon county, Pennsylvania, and obtained his early education in Pennsylvania Schools. He was graduated from the Pennsylvania State College, receiving the degree of B. S. in 1894, and later the higher degree of C. E. He taught here, in the Department of Civil Engineering for several years, during which time a large part of his time was given to the teaching of applied mechanics. While here, he made an excellent reputation as a teacher.
