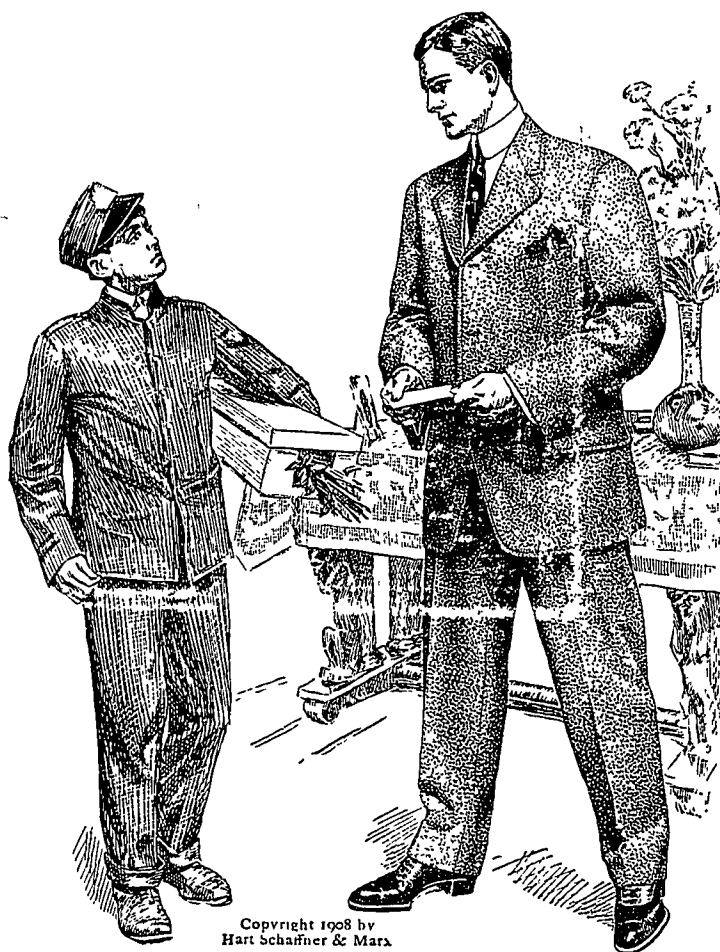
ALUMNI NOTES.
