## Report of Faculty Meeting.

At a meeting of the general faculty held November 24th, the following actions were taken:

A vote of thanks to Mr. Carnegie for his additional gift to the Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching was ordered.

The following rule, on the recommendation of the standing committee on athletics, was amended to read as follows:

"The Faculty Committee on Athletics shall have jurisdiction over all athletic contests; and all schedules of athletic contests shall be submitted to this Committee for approval or modification before taking effect."

The committee to which was referred the subject of fixing a minimum number of hours for students' schedules reported that there was no occasion for any change from the present practice, which is that a student's schedule should have twenty credit hours assigned. Any exceptions to this general rule should be made by the Dean of the school in which the student is enrolled.

The committee on the matter of exemption from examinations reported that they were satisfied that the present basis was a reasonable and efficient one and that therefore they had no change to recommend.

The committee on rules of attendance reported certain changes, which were left over until the next meeting according to the custom.

Certain rules governing the requirements for military drill at the college were presented by a committee and adopted.

A committee was appointed to inquire into any changes necessary in the method of awarding scholarships and fellowships, to report at a future meeting.

A committee was appointed to examine into the matter of deficient and delinquent students, and also whether a definite system of tutoring students should be devised.

A committee was also appointed to examine into the rules concerning the seating with their classes of students who are deficient in studies, with the thought of getting a definite seating system in chapel.
