

Telegraph Service Secured.

State College is to have a Western Union Telegraph station, which will probable be located in C. E. Shuey's jewelry store. The proposition that the people of State College have made to the Western Union for several years of furnishing an office and operator if the company would put up the lines has finally been accepted.

The case was presented before the Pennsylvania State Railroad Commission in Harrisburg on January 7, J. L. Holmes acting for the people of State College. The com-

mission decided in favor of the installation, and the General Superintendent of the Western Union has promised to send a man here soon to make the necessary arrangements. It can not be definitely stated when the service will be begun, but it will be within a short time.

Free Mail Delivery.

The announcement was made last week that the postal inspector's report had been approved and that the carrier system will be installed in State College on March 1. The necessary numbering of the houses and putting the street signs in place

was completed some time ago and ved Examinations will be held on Jan. 23 for the position of clerk-carrier, notices of which have been posted throughout the town.

For the present the carrier will deliver the mail to the college dormitories, and the college authorities will then distribute it to the various rooms. Drop letter boxes will be placed at most of the street intersections, as well as at the Agricultural building, McAllister Hall, and Main Building.

Further instructions will be published later as to methods by which the new system of delivery can be facilitated.
