## COLLEGE NOTES.

Last Tuesday evening at Westminster College, New Wilmington, Pa., Dr Benjamin Gill acted as one of the judges on the merits of speaking, in the annual debate between the colleges represented in the Tri-State Oratorical Association of Western Pennsylvania. There are six colleges in this association as follows: Muskingum (O.), Waverburg, Bethany, Geneva, Allegheny, and Westminster. It was quite an honor for Dr. Gill to be selected as one of the judges, for the orators all come from classical schools and are well trained as speakers.

The Rev. J. McKendree Reiley, a graduate of Baltimore City college '97, and of Drew Theological Seminary '02, and at present, pastor of State College Methodist church will speak at the Christian association meeting Sunday at 6 p. m. in the old chapel. His former charge was at Clearfield, Pa. for seven years. He has a strong brotherhood there and the State men who know him and his work speak enthusiastically of him.

### A Faculty Exchange.

As a means of communication between members of the faculty and of students with faculty, a Faculty Exchange has been established in the Business Office in the Main building. Each member of the faculty is assigned a combination box. The door to the room is open daily except Sunday from 7:30 a. m. to 7:30 p. m., and a slip is provided at the door for depositing mail and small packages. No United States or stamped mail will be handled in the Exchange. Official notices coming from any office intended for all members of the faculty can be distributed through the Exchange without bearing individual addresses. Mr. William S. Dye, Jr. has kindly consented to look

after the Exchange. It is inaugurated as a means of economy in postage and addressing, and every one interested is solicited to aid in making it a success.

### Indian Meet.

The Indians won the meet on Monday by a large score, 78 1-2 to 25 1-2. The absence of Bevan, who was called home on account of the serious illness of his brother and of Berry and Armsby who were not allowed to take the trip on account of a faculty ruling, was felt. In the two mile run Watts, who finished second, ran it in 10 minutes 10 1-5 seconds, 7 2 5 seconds lower than the record of Barnes '04. Thorpe started, taking five firsts and a second. Score:

440 yard dash—First, Smith, State; second, Moore, Carlisle. Time, 52 3-5 seconds.

Two mile run First, Lewanima, Carlisle; second, Watts, State. Time, 10 minutes 6 3-5 seconds.

Half mile run—First, Hay, State; second, Friday, Carlisle. Time, 2 minutes 5 3-5 seconds.

220 yard dash First, Smith, State; second, Dupuis, Carlisle. Time, 24 1-5 seconds.
