

VILLANOVA GAMES

Our Team Loses Two Games to Our Old Rivals. They Have won Three Straight From us.

"Andy" Lytle's final sentiment that, "It was the Dutch," will have to be altered if we look back over our present baseball season. Of the six games we have lost, five have been to college teams whose members are proud of Emerald Isle ancestry; three contests have been dropped to Villanova and one each to Georgetown and Notre Dame. Verily we must change the old expression to read, "It was the Irish."

Last Friday and Saturday saw Villanova's sturdy team of clever ball players here for two games. The first was a redhot affair in which we had to play an uphill game from the start. A high outfield fly from Monahan's bat in the fifth inning, which dropped safe, was directly responsible for three runs and the score stood 4 to 0 in the visitors' favor when State came to bat in the sixth.

Then we had our chance. Leidich got to first on a missed third strike, Klepfer went out from pitcher to first and Kelly was thrown out on a hard drive to right field. With two men out "Larry" singled and Eberlein hit a long drive to left for three bases. Hirshman singled but McCleary could not land on Barry's fast curves and the three runs secured were all we got. In each of the remaining innings a great effort was made to tie up the score and win the game, but when Barr pulled down Workman's hard liner in the ninth the "jig was up." Klepfer pitched a fine game and deserved to win but things were breaking Villanova's way. The contest was one of the most exciting ever played on Beaver field and everyone looked forward to victory on Saturday over the Main liners.

It was not to be, however. Captain Savage's men got seven hits and five runs from Skemp in the first three innings, this being the first instance that the big southpaw has proved ineffective this year. Then McCleary went to the mound at the beginning of the fourth but our men had an off-day and played the most ragged baseball they have played this year. Blythe was spiked in the ninth inning while touching Savage as he slid to second; then Vorhis went to short and Thomas behind the bat. Workman hit well as "Larry" had done the day before. Continually the crowd pulled hard for a victory but we suffered our first defeat on New Beaver field, Friday's game being played on the old grounds which were in better condition.
