## Second Annual Intercollegiate Track Meet.

The White and Blue gained third place in last Saturday's big field meet at Harrisburg, one notch higher than last year. Our total of nineteen points would have been greatly increased but for some unfortunate incidents. Cyphers got to the Capitol city too late to qualify for the meet; "Hep" Hay was leading in the half-mile run when his muscles became cramped and he was carried to the bench in great pain; and finally Armsby, who was the first man over the last hurdle in the first heat of the 120 yard high hurdles, slackened his pace to save himself for the final race and was passed by two runners.

Watts ran a beautiful race in the two mile event; he was always at Tewanima's heels and covered the distance in 10 minutes 7 seconds, which is 9 seconds faster than his record made against Swarthmore on May 15! Howarth also ran sturdily in the mile, while Berry, Bevan and Pier were our other point winners in the races, the time of which was

very fast considering the high wind. Mathers, our broad jumper and low-hurdle man, has been improving with steady strides this year and he will be a most valuable man before graduation in 1911. Captain Maurhoff of our team and Phipps of Swarthmore were again tied in the pole vault, as at the meet here on May 15 with the Garnet and White. This time the record was 11 feet, one inch higher than before.

Our University of Pittsburg rivals did not secure a point while the Indians led the procession: Indians 61 points; Lafayette 49; Penn State 19; Dickinson 9; Swarthmore 8; Lehigh 6; Washington and Jefferson 2. The summary follows:

Half mile run—First, Moore, Indians; second, Paxson, Lafayette; third, Landrine, Lafayette; fourth, Two Hearts, Indians. Time—2 minutes 2 1-5 seconds.
