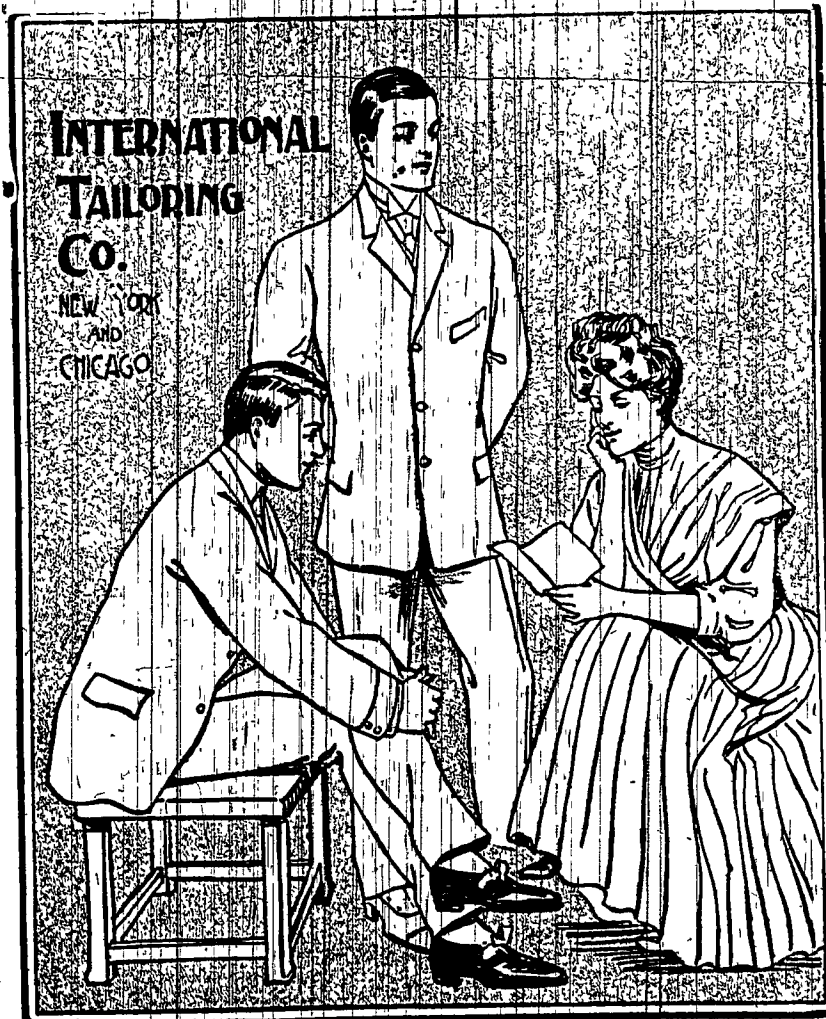
Hammer throw—First, Thomas, Indians; second, Rumbaugh, Lafayette; third, Gardner, Indians. Distance—121 feet 11 inches.
