Some changes in the administration of the Library for the current year are made that will prove helpful. The newspapers are now filed in the room at right of entrance, Room A. This relieves the congestion in the periodical room. Bound sets may now be comfortably used in the latter room, and are not to be taken from the room.

About a thousand volumes have been added to the Library during the summer. Many of these are now upon the shelves. The latest accessions may be consulted in the case labeled "New Accessions" in the reading room, and upon the tables in the several alcoves.

Carefully selected lists of books for general reading by students will shortly be placed at the desk for distribution; also a handbook of information about the classes and location of books, the catalogues, indexes, reference books, etc.


