Pharsonian Minstrel Elections.

Last Saturday night the Pharsonian elections were held and resulted as follows: President, W. L. McCoy; secretary, F. H. Johnson; manager, Robert Buka to succeed F. C. Clifford, resigned; treasurer, Prof. P. O. Ray.

President Sparks will represent the college at the inauguration of President Lowell at Harvard University this week and of President Nichols at Dartmouth college next week. He will also attend meetings of Penn State alumni clubs at New York, Boston, and Schenectady.

Lafayette Game Declared Off.

Negotiations between our manager McKee and manager J. O. Parker of the Lafayette eleven, which were carried on early this week, have left us practically without a game for October thirtieth. While the Maroon and White football man still wishes Penn State to hold open the date mentioned, there is little likelihood of our playing the Easton college this year, although every effort was made by the White and Blue to arrange the contest.

On our part manager McKee offered to play in Easton this fall with a return game at State College next fall, or vice versa; he also made a liberal and substantial offer to play coach Folwell's eleven at Altoona, which is what the Altoona people have been persistently after and what our student body wants, but a rule allowing Lafayette to play only three games away from home each season appears to interfere with this arrangement. Everything in our power was done to meet Lafayette and the "Collegian" sincerely regrets that a football game with such a worthy foe as Lafayette seems now to be out of the question. It is extremely late in the year to get an opponent to take Lafayette's place but no stone will be left unturned to do so.

A Correction.

The Collegian wishes to make a correction for the announcement made last week that there would be Catholic services every Sunday in the Agricultural building. The services are held only twice a month, next Sunday being the first time since September 26.

The Athletic association discovered, too late for correction, that nominations for assistant general athletic managers could not be made until one week before the elections. They have therefore been postponed to Oct. 25.

As we go to press the registrar reports an enrollment of 499 new students for this year.
