STATE 46. GENEVA O.

Geneva Badly Beaten Last Saturday in One-sided Contest. Substitutes Show up Well.

The spectators were not left in doubt very long that "Our Team" was going to roll up a big score against Geneva last Saturday, for the first touchdown was made by "Bull" McCleary in less than four minutes after the game began. After that it was a stern-chase in which the visitors from Beaver Falls never had a chance to catch up, for our good backs, Hermann, McCleary, Hirshman and captain Vorhis, seldom gained less than ten or fifteen yards at a time. Several long forward passes were executed nicely and on one of these Very made a spectacular run of forty-five yards for a touchdown. The strange part of the play in this half was that "Dick" Smith could make little or no gain on his several attempts at long end runs, but the big fellow was saving up for the important games when the long runs count more. There was a snap to the varsity play in the first period and fast, hard, telling football resulted in the tally at the end of the first half being, State 34; Geneva 0.

The 'ginger' was lacking somewhat after that for our eleven scored only a dozen points against coach McKean's aggregation during the second half. Metheny, Miller and Dobbins made some good tackles at this stage of the game and the visitors succeeded several times in making first downs on the strong, scrub eleven which

stituted. Once Stewart unexpectedly returned Mauthe's punt back over
the big freshman's head and McCarter got the pigskin with a seemingly clear field but Doster brought
him down from behind on State's
fifteen yard line. The scare was of
short duration though, for the visiting quarterback had been offside
when picking up the ball.

That incident was followed immediately by Geneva having another good chance to score. A fumble gave them the oval on our twenty-five yard line and Miller dropped back for a try at field goal after State had held captain Smith's eleven for downs. The attempt fell short and it was only a matter of seconds until the ball was again out of danger. Engel played brilliantly in the second half.
