We now plan to hold a Memorial Service for him and to publish the proceedings in a pamphlet. It is especially desirable to have expressions from the Alumni and former students who were familiar with Mr. Patterson and who know the quiet work he did for thirty-seven years to build up this institution.

Will you be so good as to send me at an early date such a tribute as you may wish to give to this worthy man? All contributions must necessarily be brief.
