Schenectady Alumni Proceedings.

The Schenectady Alumni Association gave a banquet to Dr. Sparks at the New Vendome hotel, Schenectady, N. Y., on the evening of Oct. 12. The banquet was entirely informal, the chief aim being to meet Dr. Sparks and talk of college affairs.
