Princeton, Cornell and Pennsylvania are on our baseball schedule this year as usual, but the two big games with Harvard and Michigan, which appeared last year, are not on manager Sutton's card for 1910. No colleges will be played by captain McCleary's nine this spring who have never been met by Peun State on the diamond before, but the schedule is a very attractive one including twenty-one games, besides the Alumni and All-Class contests which will be played on New Beaver Field during Commencement week.
