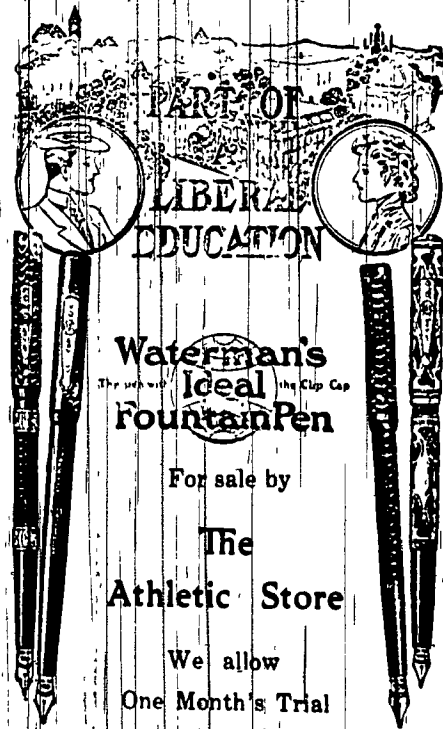
#### Cosmopolitan Club.

This Association is represented in all the large universities of the country and is doing excellent work for the betterment of the foreign students, and by work at the Lake Mohonk Conference, for the establishment of universal peace.

We have here quite a number of foreign students, the following countries being represented at the recent meeting: seven Russians, five Porto Ricans, four Cubans, one Italian and one Polander. Several Americans were present and showed much interest in the movement. "Ben" Smith '11 was elected temporary chairman and Osuna '11 was elected secretary. A committee was also appointed to draw up a constitution and by-laws.
