

Wrestling Prospects.

It is quite evident that our recent meet with Penn has thrown a scare into the camps of many of our prospective future opponents, for it is with great difficulty that Manager McNary can secure any of the teams that were manifestly so eager to meet us earlier in the season. The Navy seems somewhat reluctant to accept our terms, rather preferring to meet Yale, their argument being that they can take the Blue on, with much less expense than they can Penn State. Our next hope, Cornell, cannot give us a satisfactory date and unless Columbia fails to produce a team to meet the Ithacans on March 5, in which case State will get the date, it seems quite improbable that we will wrestle with them this year. If, however, Columbia should be unable to get their team together, and not enter the intercollegiate this year, State will undoubtedly take her place, but this, as well as the other meets, is as yet very uncertain. No definite arrangements have yet been made with Lehigh. Every effort is being made to get a return meet with Penn in Philadelphia and if such an agreement is made, there can be no doubt but that State will give a good account of herself.

The team itself is in the best of shape and the men are continually in hard training. The vacancy in the 115 lb. class made by Oberly's leaving college; has made it necessary to try out many new men, and it is gratifying to see the large number of candidates that have turned out to try for the coveted place. The men are working every night and the season is by no means over, so if you have any wrestling ability, do not hesitate to go to the Armory and help State in this new athletic field.
