Groff Day exercises will be observed next Sunday, Feb. 27th, at 11 a. m. in the Auditorium. George Weidman Groff, '07, is State's representative in the Canton Christian College. Last year \$1,010 was raised for his support. State College stands third in her giving to missions, in Pennsylvania The University of Penn. gave \$16,052, and Mercersburg Academy gave \$1,200.

This year we will have missions presented from the laymen's standpoint. We are particularly fortunate this year in having Dr. and Mrs. William J. Scheffelin, of New York, General and Mrs. Beaver, and E. C. Mercer, as our guests. It will be a student meeting, and there will be special music and decorations. Dr. Beed, who sees things from a world's standpoint, says that 99-100 % of the institutions of the world have not so complete a mission

program as Penn State has planned this year.

A committee of 115 undergraduates has been appointed to take charge of the work of furthering the cause of missions at this time.

The speakers for the day will no doubt present the needs of Penn State in the mission field in a convincing manner and it is hoped that this year we will eclipse all former records, in this very commendable enterprise of Penn State.

A sketch of Dr. and Mrs. Scheffelin appears in another column, and "Ted" Mercer and General Beaver are known to the student body. Such a strong combination on the platform should draw a record attendance Sunday morning.

Dr. and Mrs. Scheffelin of New York City, are well known workers in the many religious and philanthropical societies and movements of that city. Dr. Scheffelin is a

chemist, with degrees from Columbia and Munich. He is a member of three National Chemical societies a member of four New York clubs, and an officer in the organization of nearly all of the "uplift" societies, of New York. His work in these has been very noteworthy. It is hard to say whether Dr. Scheffelin considers his work in this field his vocation or his avocation, for at the same time he is president of the firm of Scheffelin and Co., Manufacturing Chemists, and vice president of the National Association of Wholesale Druggists.

Mrs. Scheffelin, whose work among women has been as strong and successful as her husband's has been among men, is a very able assistant to her husband in the work of bettering conditions, and helping the "uplift." She is connected with various missionary societies, foreign and home.
