## What the Student Building Will Not Be.

It will not be a dormitory. The few bed rooms will be reserved for the exclusive use of the college guests.

It will con ain no restaurant or eating room; these needs are supplied by the college commons and the boarding houses.

It will not be monopolized by any one organization. Rooms for meetings, assemblies, etc., will be assign ed according to the order of application.

It wil not be exclusive through excessive charges Membership dues, if any, will be only nominal say, one dollar a year

It will contain no objectional features. The bringing of liquor into the building and the playing of gam bling games will be absolutely prohibited.

It will not be exclusive through restricted hours, but will be kept open from the early morning to a reasonable hour of the night

## A Letter to the Alumni.

"Most Colleges or Universities. having the same or even a less number of students than attend the Pennsylvania State College, have found the need of a social hall or club house as a center for student activities, an absolute necessity.
