**Good Baseball Games Coming.**

Tomorrow Bellefonte Academy will be played on New Beaver field. The prep school team downed Carnegie Tech 17 to 1 with Cheer on the rubber and Vermont 4 to 2 with Twitmir in the box last Friday and Saturday respectively, so that they are a foe to be reckoned with. The Academy boys were first beaten by a State varsity nine in 1898 and they have been easily taken into camp on half a dozen other occasions by Blue and White teams, yet their strength this year seems to merit more attention than usual.

Next Wednesday Captain McCleary's team leaves for its first eastern trip. Lehigh will be encountered at Bethlehem that day. Four times have our nines met Lehigh in the past and each struggle has resulted in a State victory although all the contests took place at Bethlehem. The last triumph was in '07 when Captain Mason's team

won 3 to 2 from one of the strongest nines the brown and white ever possessed. Hirshman won that game in the final inning with a three-base hit.

The second game of the journey is at Villanova on Thursday April 14. Last year the Main Liners won three games from us but Captain "Harmony" Ray's team turned the same trick on the Villanova tossers in 1905. The records show that we have taken only six games out of a total of fifteen from this nine and a victory on the coming trip would be exceedingly welcome.

Fordham is the third opponent on the trip and notwithstanding the notably strong teams the New Yorkers have had in the past, Old State has won five of the nine games played. "Irish" McIlveen, the present head-coach, was captain of our team when Fordham was beaten 5 to 3 in the last struggle with the New Yorkers.

Last year ill fortune nosed Penn State out of a victory over Brown and it is hoped that that defeat will be retrieved on Saturday, the sixteenth. The Providence University has had the better of us on the diamond in the past for they have won the only two games played, but it is believed that Captain McCleary's splendid nine will win the final game of the coming trip if things break at all favorably.

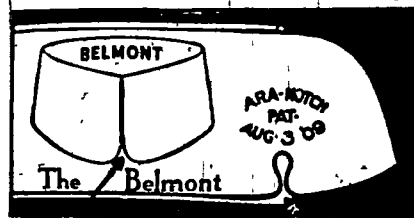
