Our men were prevented from scoring in the first, fifth and seventh innings by the rapid, heady play of the Villanova infielders, while the home team scored in the fourth on two errors and Welsh's sacrifice hit. Hirschman and Eberlein fielded brilliantly, and our men were chagrined to have the game called in the seventh because no agreement to that effect had been made before play started.

Although Fordham downed Yale in rather tame style last Saturday, they bit the dust before Penn State the day before by the score of 3 to 0. The "hit and run game" was responsible for our tallies. In the fourth inning after Workman was retired on a grounder to shortstop, Hirschman walked and Blythe doubled. Then Piolett brought both in by a single. "Shorty" pitched a steady, winning game and scored in the third when he got to first on Sharkey's error and came home on a pretty hit by the captain. As at Villanova the game was ended at 5:30 p. m.; it was started late owing to our men missing the train out of Philadelphia.

On the final game of the trip at Brown, after Hirschman's injury Carson went behind the bat, while Leidick was in left field, Piolett in right and Blythe at second base. Lynch gave the Brown and White but one hit in the first five innings and would undoubtedly have come off with a neat victory to his credit but for the scarcity of catching material. Carson, new in the catcher's position, worked pluckily and Old State with her crippled team made a finish in the last two innings that was characteristic. Until the eighth we had not secured a run.
