Interscholastic Meet This Week. The second annual interscholastic track meet of the preparatory schools of Pennsylvania will be held tomorrow afternoon on Beaver

Field. Upwards of 75 schools will have their picked teams here and appropriate gold, silver and bronze medals have been provided for the winners of the first, second and third places in the different events. The medals were given by the New York City Alumni Association.

Teams from several schools in Altoona, Wilkesbarre, Reading, Danville, Bloomsburg, Berwick and several Normal schools and academies have already entered. A scholarship will be given to the school sending the largest team the greatest distance; another four year scholarship being offered to the individual contestant scoring the highest number of points.

This interscholastic meet is a comparatively new thing in State College, being only inaugurated last year on the occasion of the opening of New Beaver Field. The meet this year promises to be one of the most important ever held in the state, and is surely a rare diplomatic stroke on the part of "Pop" Golden, who thus gets a line on all the promising track material.
