

followed event with smoothness and ease. A gratifying feature of the day was that not a single accident took place.

The times made in the track events were in all cases very creditable, and in some, remarkably good. Particularly in the sprints, the results were much better than those usually attained by "prep schools." The 100-yd. dash was won in 10 flat and the 220 was won by Castaneda of Indiana Normal in 22 flat, which is 1-5 of a second faster than our record. However everything was in favor of the sprint men. The track was in fair condition and a strong wind was blowing down the straight a-way. The time made in both hurdles was also fast, 15 3-5 in the high and 20 flat in the low hurdles. The high jump was won at 5 ft. 7 in. and the pole vault which went to 10 ft. 6 in. was an excellent exhibition for Prep. school lads. All in all the times and distances were exceptionally good; and the authorities are to be commended for their excellent management and supervision.
