

STATE-PITT HISTORY

Pitt took place and State's sons journeyed to Pittsburg undefeated under their beloved "Larry" Vorhis, while Pitt under Captain Homer Roe was in top-notch form. 'Ere the whistle's echo had long ceased, that superb backfield quintet of the Blue and White—"Larry" Vorhis, "Bull" McCleary, Lester Mauthe, "Heff" Hirshman and "Dutch" Hermann—had swung into unconquerable motion. It was their last game for alma mater and Pittsburgers had never seen such a football machine in action—more courageous, more powerful and more sportsman-like. Pitt, too, played a magnificent game and Forbes Field was dedicated to the annual State—Pitt struggle with a stubborn brilliantly fought victory for State by the score of 5 to 0.

Below is the list of the seven annual State—Pitt games which have been played in Pittsburg since 1903 with the captain and coach of each team following in order:

1903, State 59, Pitt 0, "Ed" Whitworth and Golden, "Tex" Mosse; 1904, State 5, Pitt 22, Carl Forkum and Reed, Thompson and Mosse; 1905, State 6, Pitt 0, "Ed" Yeckley and Fennell, Schmidt and Thompson; 1906, State 6, Pitt 0, "Mother" Dunn and Fennell, Marshall and Wingard; 1907, State 0, Pitt 6, "Bobby" Burns and Fennell, Marshall and Moorhead; 1908, State 12 Pitt 6, "Bull" McCleary and McIveen, Banbury and Moorhead; 1909 State 5 Pitt 0, "Larry" Vorhis and Hollenback, Roe and Thompson.

Four of these seven struggles have been won by a single touchdown and the question now on the lips of every football fan in Western Pennsylvania is,—Who will win this Thanksgiving?

Rules for Ticket Sale

1. Tickets will be sold by mail order only.
2. Sale opens Tuesday, Nov. 15, closes Tuesday, Nov. 22.
3. Use the attached order form, fill every blank, and comply strictly with its terms.
4. The rules of sale must be strictly adhered to or orders will not be filled.
5. State whether you prefer balcony or main floor, grand stand or roof, balcony or main floor boxes. Your preference will be considered while the seats last.
6. Prices: Box seats, \$2.00 each (boxes seat 8 persons). All grand stand seats, \$1.50 each.
