CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATIONS

For American Teachers in the Philippines to be Held Soon.

The United States Service commission announces an examination to be held on December 18-29, 1910, in various cities throughout the United States for industrial teachers, teacher and assistant in the Philippine service.

From the eligible list thus secured about one hundred American teachers will be selected for service in the Philippine islands. Those appointments will be made during the present school year and appointees will be furnished transportation early enough for them to reach Manila before the opening of school next year.

The assignment of these hundred teachers will be as follows: Ten to high school science, ten to industrial subjects, twenty to high and academic school subjects, five to domestic science and home economy, fifty-five as supervising teachers.

Detailed information relative to those examinations may be secured by addressing the Bureau of Insular Affairs, Washington, D. C.
