

CROSS COUNTRY

H. W. Foulds, '13 with Three Minute Handicap Captures First Place. Best Cross Country Run Ever Held Here.

The interest displayed in the cross country run on Saturday afternoon brought many out to witness this annual affair. Up to the finish the winners were hard to pick owing to the way in which every man was hard pressed by those behind him. In spite of the deep snow that covered the ground excellent time was made for the 5.4 miles that constituted the course. Out of twenty-five men who started the race all finished in good time except four who dropped out along the road.

Foulds, '13 took first place, covering the course in 38 minutes 35 seconds with a three minute handicap. Lumm '13, one of the scratch men secured tenth place and at the same time captured the medal for running the distance in the best time which was 35 minutes 30 seconds. He was followed closely by Fischer '13, who crossed the tape only ten seconds behind the winner of the time prize. The Sophomores were the victors of the run, but the closeness of the race can only be judged by the order in which the men of the two under classes finished, the tenth place being necessary to decide the winning class.

Fifteen prizes including the time prize were awarded to the first fourteen men who crossed the tape. The winners of the prizes finished in the order named—Foulds '13, Booth '13, Swisher '13, Shetron '14, Seybert '14, Fischer '13, Savery '14, Leyden '14, Taylor, special, Lumm '13, Fussel '14, Morgan '13, Allisoa '11, and Ashbrook '14. The valuable awards that were given were donated by merchants of the town and much is due them for the success of the cross country run.

GERMAN PLAY A SUCCESS

"Der Neffe als Onkel" Produced on Monday Night.

Schiller's three-act comedy "Der Neffe als Onkel" was rendered in excellent manner on Dec. 12, under the direction of the Deutscher Verein. The capable and well balanced cast is to be most sincerely congratulated, as are also the competent coaches, Miss Simmons, Mr. Boucke, and Mr. Scheib. The entire play, with its intricate plot, humorous disclosures, and delicate acting was given in a charming way that completely delighted the audience. The German of the players was good, and the acting was excellent. The College Orchestra added particular zest to the setting by its usual good playing.

Credit for the success of the production can be ascribed to no particular star, but to a uniformly good cast with excellent team work. Miss Kessler upheld her reputation of former years, and did splendid work in the part of "Sophie." Miss Ancona as "Frau von Mirville", and Miss Weiss, as "Frau V. Dorsigny" were also strong contributing factors to the action of the play. Among the male characters particularly in evidence were Mr. Ohleen, as "Franz", Mr. Shryock, as "Der Oberst", Mr. Cronmeyer, as "Champagne", Mr. Dose, as "Lormeuil", Mr. Amschler, as "Valcour" and Mr. Blouch, as the "Postillon". All the other members, however, fulfilled in excellent fashion their several parts, and produced a large part of the final result.

Although the audience was not as large as could be desired, it was an enthusiastic and appreciative one. Yet it seems peculiar that among our large numbers, so small a proportion are interested in the German language and literature. When an opportunity is given us to hear a
