**Debating.**

Our varsity debating teams are kept busy at present getting into shape for the approaching inter-collegiate debates. Under the new rules of the league each of the four colleges has two teams which debate the same question on the same date, but on opposite sides. The four colleges comprising the league are, Swarthmore, Dickinson, Franklin and Marshall, and Penn State. The debates will take place on Friday, March 3, '11.

The question for debate is "Resolved that our legislation should be shaped toward the gradual abandonment of the tariff". One team from each college will meet a similar team from one of the other colleges in the league at home, while the other team will debate with another college at the home of the latter. This will make it possible to have a debate at each college on the same date which, it is hoped will create a deeper and greater interest throughout the league.

According to the arrangement for this year our team composed of F. C. Dose '14, E. H. Seigler '11, J. A. Kinney '12, and, H. M. Keebler '11, alt., will go to Swarthmore to uphold the affirmative side of the question, while the other team composed of W. D. Meikel '11, E. S. Ross '14, Jose Osuna '12, and, J. P. Rossiter '14, alt., will defend the negative against Dickinson at home.

A trophy is to be awarded for one year to the college gaining the greatest number of victories for the ensuing year, and is to be granted permanently to the college winning the most debates in three years.

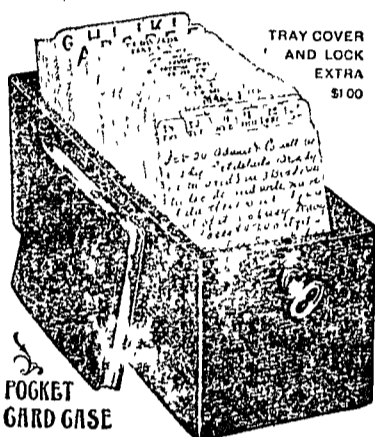
Entertained Senior Metallurgical Engineers.
