Dr. T. F. Hunt, Dean of the School of Agriculture, who has been touring Europe since last August, returned last Sunday after spending nine months in profitable travel. During that time, Dean Hunt visited Germany, Switzerland, Holland, Belgium, France and Italy, spending about five months of that period in France. He found an excellent opportunity to see agricultural conditions in France and in the Rhine valley, and made a detailed study of the facilities for agricultural education in the former country. While on this extended trip, many interesting photographs were secured of the conditions encountered on the continent.
