Sec. 6. The Graduate Manager shall be the financial agent of the Association. He shall make all contracts and schedules and be directly responsible for all business transacted under the Association.

Sec. 7. The Minor Sports Council shall be the governing body of the Association. Their actions are subject to the approval of the Faculty Advisory Committee

ARTICLE V

Wrestling Department

Section 1. The officers of the Wrestling Department shall be a Captain, a Manager, and three Assistant Managers.

Sec. 2. Immediately after the close of the wrestling season, the Minor Sports Council shall, by ballot, choose the manager for the following year.

Sec. 3. The Wrestling Department, i. e. the members of the wrestling squad, together with the retiring manager and the manager elect, shall, after the election stated in Section 2 of this article, elect three assistant managers from the Sophomore class.

Sec. 4. The Wrestling Squad shall be determined by the Captain and Minor Sports Athletic Director.

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the Student Manager under the direct supervision of the Graduate Manager to attend to all business matters incident to this department. He shall keep a record of games played, players, and length of time played by each man, on a special blank furnished him by the Secretary. This blank shall be properly filled out and signed by the Manager and handed to the Secretary immediately after each game to be filed away for future reference.

Sec. 6. It shall be the duty of the three assistant managers under the direction of the Graduate Manager to render all necessary aid to the other officers of this department, to take charge of all trophies belonging to the department, and to preserve order in the gymnasium.

Sec. 7. The Captain for the following season shall be elected by members of the season's team entitled to wear the "S. W. T."

Sec. 8. The Captain shall have absolute direction of his team on the floor during a meet. He shall have the decisive vote in the selection of his team and shall act in conjunction with the Minor Sports Athletic Director and the Coach, should there be one, in all matters pertaining to the welfare of his team.

Sec. 9. The privilege of wearing the S. W. T. shall be granted to any member who has participated in one-half the regularly scheduled meets and to the regularly elected student manager.

ARTICLE VI

Tennis Department

Section 1. The officers of the Tennis Department shall be a Captain, a Manager and three Assistant Managers.

Sec. 2. Immediately after the close of the Tennis season in June, the Minor Sports Council shall, by ballot, choose the manager for the ensuing year.

Sec. 3. The Tennis Department, i. e. the members of the Tennis squad together with the retiring manager and manager elect shall, after the election stated in Section

2, of this article, elect three assistant managers from the Sophomore class.

Sec. 4. The tennis squad shall consist of all the men who have taken part in any of the regularly scheduled college tournaments, or meets with other colleges

Sec. 5. It shall be the duty of the Student Manager under the direct supervision of the Graduate Manager to attend to all business matters incident to this department. He shall keep a record of games played and the players on a special blank furnished him by the Secretary. This blank shall be properly filled out and signed by the Manager and handed to the Secretary immediately after each game to be filed away for future reference.

Sec. 6. It shall be the duty of the three assistant managers under the direction of the Graduate Manager to render all necessary aid to the other officers of this department, to take charge of all trophies belonging to the department, and to preserve order on the courts.

Sec. 7. The Captain for the following season shall be elected by members of the season's team who have participated in one-half the regular scheduled meets, and the student manager.

Sec. 8. The Captain shall have absolute direction of his team on the courts during a match. He shall have the decisive vote in the selection of his team and shall act in conjunction with the Minor Sports Athletic Director and the Coach, should there be one, in all matters pertaining to the welfare of his team.

ARTICLE VII

Intercollege Department

Section 1. This department shall be made up of the various class league teams and any other intercollege teams which may exist and which in the opinion of the Minor Sports Council deserve recognition in this department

Sec. 2. The officers of each of these teams shall be a Captain and a Manager.

Sec. 3. The managers of the teams shall be elected by the various classes.

Sec. 4. The duties of officers in this department correspond to those of the officers of the wrestling and tennis departments.

Sec. 5. The award of numerals, trophies, etc. shall be governed by the Minor Sports Council in connection with the captain and manager from the various teams.

Sec. 6. When any team in the Intercollege Department obtains sufficient prominence and success it will be placed in a separate department and its members awarded the S. P. T. This matter is to be decided by the Minor Sports Association.

ARTICLE VIII

Amendments

Any part of this constitution or by-laws may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds vote of all active members, provided that the proposed change shall have been published at least two weeks before.

ARTICLE IX

Ratifications

This constitution and by-laws shall go into effect immediately upon ratification and all officers then serving and fulfilling the requirements shall retain their office until the same shall expire under this

constitution and by-laws. This constitution and by-laws shall be printed in the State Collegian in order that each active member of the association may obtain a copy

BY LAWS

ARTICLE I

Meetings

Sec. 1. The Association shall call its meetings at such time and place as the President may direct.

Sec. 2. The President shall hold a meeting at the request of three active members.

Sec. 3. Forty per cent of the resident active members shall constitute a quorum

ARTICLE II

Finances

Section 1. Each department must be self supporting. The Intercollege department is divided into sub-departments, each one of which is self supporting.

Sec. 2. Money from one department cannot be used by another department, except by action of the Minor Sports Council in connection with the various captains and managers concerned.

ARTICLE III

Any part of the By-laws, excepting Article I Section 3 and Article II, may be amended or repealed at a meeting by two-thirds vote of the active members present.
