

Mr. Lassalle Gains Advancement.

Leopold Joseph Lassalle, instructor in Physics, has recently received an appointment to a fellowship in the Department of Physics and in the Ogden School of Sciences of the University of Chicago. This is an unusual and very flattering favor to one who is in no way connected with that institution. After completing his duties here for the year, Mr. Lassalle will avail himself of this splendid opportunity for study and advancement by taking up work which will lead to a Doctor's degree from that university. He will be granted a leave of absence for a year and a half and at the expiration of that time it is expected that he will return to the position he now holds.

Mr. Lassalle was graduated from Louisiana State University in 1908 and served as an instructor in that institution the following year. During the summer of 1909, he studied at the University of Chicago whence he came to "State" to assume the duties of instructor in the Physics department. While here, he has completed a thesis for a Master's degree which will be conferred on him by this College in June.

Sunday Evening Concert.
