Were You at Sunday Chapel?

A very successful campaign in the interest of systematic giving was completed in Sunday chapel when over five hundred men pledged themselves to contribute every Sunday to the benevolent work of the college. As all Penn State men know the college supports a colored secretary in the Y. M. C. A. work in Brunswick county, Virginia. In addition to this work the college has pledged itself for a thousand dollars which will be used in the agricultural mission in China which is in the hands of "Daddy" Groff of the class of 1907.

Last year only 310 men out of a total enrollment of 2003 contributed \$825 to this work. This year the amount pledged will amount to \$1500. As the total budget will amount to \$1700 it is hoped that men who were not at chapel and did not have an opportunity to pledge their support will feel the importance of this work and help in it. The college Y. M. C. A. office will furnish cards to any who may wish to pledge themselves to contribute systematically. Envelopes will be furnished which are to be used every Sunday in the regular offering.

The Penn State Glee Club will hold a concert here on Saturday, Oct. 12 at 8 o'clock. This concert is to take the place of the one which the Coburn players were to present. This concert no doubt will be of special interest, as it is the first given by the Glee Club under the leadership of Mr. Robinson. Admission to be 35 and 50 cents.

ENGINEERING NOTES.

The contractors began work on the College sewage disposal plant on last Monday. Several small wooden structures have already been erected at the site, and will serve as temporary quarters for the men and offices.

The section of senior Mechanical Engineering students made a trip to Altoona Sept. 28-29th making tests at the locomotive testing plant in connection with some investigations on smoke prevention in locomotives.

The Westinghouse Air Brake company is sending to the college one of their new cross compound air compressors to be used in connection with tests of modern air brake equipment. The tests that are to be made concern principally the advantages of using superheated steam in compound compressors.

Professor J. A. Moyer has prepared and submitted a paper on "Smoke Washing and Electrostatic Treatment of Smoke," which will be read before the American Society of Mechanical Engineers at their New York meeting Oct. 8, 1912.

Glee Club Concert.

The first of this season's concerts to be given by the Penn State Glee Club, under the direction of Mr. Robinson, Director of Music, will take place next Saturday evening, Oct. 12 at eight o'clock in the Auditorium.
