Although Penn State is essentially a scientific school there are certain of the academic or classical courses-such as History, Political Science, Foreign Languages and English - which men in every course must take These courses are necessities for every college man who wishes to see things in their broadest light. And in the same way Penn State in her relations with other colleges, must meet them in as many lines of contest as possible, so that the fame and good name of our school may be spread among these other colleges in other ways besides athletics.

One of the ways by which Penn State can and is making her name better known and respected is by our Debating Teams. Penn State is one of four colleges who comprise what is known as The Pennsylvania Intercollegiate Debating League, the other three colleges being Dickinson, Swarthmore and Franklin and Marshall.
