#### Departmental Notes

The departmental of Mechanical Engineering will conduct a short course in milling engineering this summer, beginning July 10 and ending August 15. This course will consist of lectures, practical demonstrations with the flour milling equipment of the college, and laboratory work in the chemical analysis of cereals and baking tests to determine the quality of flour.
