### In the College World

The women of Ohio State University have adopted the senior counselor system for the first time this year.

The F. and M. Weekly writes as follows: "With the rushing season on us in full blast, the evils of the system in vogue here once more attracts attention. The injury which a fraternity or club suffers through this system is a grievous one. Its ideals are debased, its honor stained, and its most guarded treasure, its harmony, is threatened. Yet disastrous as the system is to the fraternity or club, it is the freshman who feels most deeply its injustice. Wide-eyed, ignorant and susceptible, he is coerced to choose in a few short hours, his social companions for the four crucial years of his life. Without any preparation, without a proper opportunity of examination, he is grabbed and called upon to assume a tie less close only than those that bind to mother and sweetheart."
